Purpose

- i** The Competition Management Committee has a safety plan and emergency plan for:
- The general safety of athletes, competition personnel, and spectators during the competition.
 - The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** personnel and procedures are in place in case of minor or major incidents involving injury or illness of competitors, competition personnel and spectators.

The following overview will outline the facility that will be utilized during the **Alberta/Northwest Territories Lifesaving Championships and Junior Games**. It will clearly identify those authorized persons to initiate the Safety and Emergency Plan and outline command and control functions.

General procedures can be found in the **Mayer Aquatic Centre Emergency Procedures**, in conjunction with Alberta Legislation and Regulations pertaining to pool operations.

Facility Access

- i** The facility can be accessed via the appropriate entryways. The event will be open to registered competitors, coaches, officials, and volunteers. Spectators can access the facility but will be restricted from accessing the pool deck area.

Major and Minor Incidents

The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff will notify the appointed Lifesaving Society Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury and possible fracture.

- i** The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** will be supervised by certified Lifesaving Society National Lifeguards employed by the **City of Camrose**. Employees will respond to emergencies as per the **Mayer Aquatic Centre Emergency Procedures**. The Competition Management Committee will assist with managing the competition participants and volunteers during an emergency.

Medical Facilities

On-site Service:


All first aid services can be provided within the **Mayer Aquatic Centre**. It is at the discretion of the **Mayer Aquatic Centre Emergency Procedures** as to whether injured/ill persons should be transported to a facility off-site.

Code of Conduct

All volunteers, officials, competitors, and coaches shall adhere to the Codes of Conduct outlined in the most recent editions of the **Alberta/Northwest Territories Competition Manual, the ILS Competition Rule Book, and the Lifesaving Society Alberta and Northwest Territories Branch Policies and Procedures.**

-  The Competition Management Committee will be responsible for enforcement of the codes. Anyone not adhering to the safety procedures as prescribed in the **Alberta/Northwest Territories Competition Manual and ILS Competition Rule Book** may be disqualified or removed from the property. Unsafe actions and behaviours will not be tolerated.

Competition Personnel

-  The Competition Management Committee has designated an individual to be the Safety Officer for the competition. The designated Safety Officer is to liaise with the **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff regarding competition safety. **The Mayer Aquatic Centre** will be required to report and document any incidents that occur at the facility during the event.

The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff will be responsible for initiating the **Mayer Aquatic Centre** Emergency Safety Plan.

Operational Procedures

- i** Operational procedures require the facility to meet the minimum Alberta Legislation and Regulations pertaining to pool operations. Lifesaving Sport competition may require temporary alterations to these, for example, circulation may need to be turned down or off to minimize the movement of the manikins once they are placed.

Any required alterations regarding pool operation will be communicated to the **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff by the designated competition personnel.

Emergency Procedures

- i** The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff will notify the designated Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on-site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury, and possible fracture.

The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** will be supervised by certified Lifesaving Society National Lifeguards employed by the **City of Camrose**. Employees will respond to emergencies as per the **Mayer Aquatic Centre Emergency Procedures**. The Competition Management Committee will assist with managing the competition participants and volunteers during an emergency.


General Safety

The **Mayer Aquatic Centre** will adhere to all applicable Alberta Legislation and Regulations as well as facility specific rules that will be followed for patron safety.


- i** Certified Lifesaving Society National Lifeguards are to be supplied by the facility for the duration of the event.

All general rules and procedures pertaining to competitions will be followed as per the most recent editions of the **Alberta/Northwest Territories Competition Manual, the Canadian Competition Manual, and the ILS Competition Rule Book**.

Warmups

-  Competitors should observe all warmup procedures in accordance with the Lifesaving Society Sanctioned Warmup Procedures and **Mayer Aquatic Centre** staff.

Contingency Plans

-  *All contingency plans are decided by the Competition Management Committee. The Committee has the right to postpone, reschedule, or cancel an event or competition if the venue is deemed unsafe.*
