Purpose	<p>The YMCA Royals Invitational Committee has a safety and emergency plan for: The general safety of athletes, competition personnel and spectators during the competition. YMCA Calgary personnel and procedures are in place in case of minor or major incidents involving injury or illness of competitors, competition personnel and spectators. The following overview will outline the facility that will be utilized during the YMCA Royals Open Invitational. It will clearly identify those authorized persons to initiate the Safety and Emergency Plan and outline command and control functions. General procedures can be found in the YMCA Calgary Seton Branch Emergency Procedures, in conjunction with Alberta Legislation and Regulations pertaining to pool operations.</p> <p>The Host has a designated Safety Officer. The designated Safety Officer is to liaise with YMCA Calgary staff regarding competition safety. Operational Procedures	Operational procedures require the facility meet the minimum Alberta Legislation and Regulations. Lifesaving sport competition may require temporary alterations to these, for example, circulation may need to be turned down/off to minimize the movement of the manikins once they are placed.

Emergency Procedures	YMCA Calgary facility staff will notify the appointed Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury and possible fracture. The YMCA Calgary Seton branch will be supervised by Lifesaving Society certified National Lifeguards that are employed by YMCA Calgary. Employees will deal with emergencies per the YMCA Calgary emergency procedures. The YMCA Royals Invitational Committee will assist with managing the participants and volunteers during an emergency.
Code of Conduct	All volunteers, officials, competitors, and coaches should adhere to the Codes of Conduct outlined Page 1 of 3 in the most recent version of the ABNWT Competition Manual and any supporting rule book. The YMCA Royals Invitational Committee will be responsible for enforcement of these codes. Anyone not adhering to the safety procedures as prescribed in the above-mentioned Competition Manuals may be disqualified or removed from the property. Unsafe actions and behaviors will not be tolerated.
Contingency Plans	All contingency plans are decided by the YMCA Royals Invitational Committee. The committee has the right to postpone, reschedule, or cancel an event or competition if the venue is deemed unsafe.
General Safety	The YMCA Calgary Seton Branch will adhere to the Alberta Legislation and Regulations as well as facility specific rules that will be followed for patron safety. Lifesaving Society Certified National Lifeguards will be supplied by the facility for the duration of the event. All general rules and procedures pertaining to competitions can be found in the most recent AB/NWT Competition manual and any supporting documents.
Major-Minor Incidents	YMCA Calgary staff will notify the appointed Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury and possible fracture. The YMCA Calgary Seton branch will be supervised by Lifesaving Society certified National Lifeguards that are employed by YMCA Calgary. Employees will deal with emergencies per the YMCA Calgary emergency procedures. The YMCA Royals Invitational Committee will assist with managing the participants and volunteers during an emergency.
Medical Facilities	<p>On Site Service: All first aid services can be provided within the YMCA Calgary Seton branch.
